#### Cost

On the other hand, with your hotspots, you have limitations on your cellular data plan. You may experience throttling after exceeding certain thresholds.

#### **Dedicated Connection**

When using a personal hotspot, your mobile device may need to split its internet connection between the vehicle and other devices, such as your laptop or smartwatch.

However, Premium Connectivity offers a dedicated connection specifically for your Tesla vehicle. So with the paid network, there are zero chances of interference.

#### Vehicle Integration
